

Raffaella Campaner is Full Professor of Philosophy of Science and, since November 2021, Vice-Rector for International Relations at the University of Bologna. She graduated in Philosophy at the University of Trieste in 1996, took a Master in Philosophy (M. Litt) at the University of St. Andrews (Scotland) in 1998, and a PhD in Philosophy at the University of Trieste in 2000. Her research has addressed philosophical theories of scientific explanation, conceptions of causation, scientific models, with a specific focus on the biomedical sciences. Among her authored volumes, *Varieties of Causal Explanation in Medical Contexts* (2019); *Explaining Disease: Philosophical Reflections on Medical Research and Clinical Practice* (2022). She has been an EPSA (European Philosophy of Science Association) Steering Committee member (2015-2019), since April 2024 is a member of the Advisory Committee for the Graduate School of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, and has taken part into various international evaluation processes (for ESF; FWO; ANR). Since 2019 she is Life Member of Clare Hall College, Cambridge. Since the same year she is a member of the Governing Council of the Magna Charta Observatory, of the Management Board of the IHEA Foundation, of the Scientific Boards of the Centro de Altos Estudios de la Universidad de Bologna – Representación en la República Argentina and of the Asia Institute.
